- Give your own title if one has not been given.
- Spend approximately 60 minutes on this section.
- 1.1 "If only I had known ..."



QUESTION 2

- Respond to ONE of the following transactional writing tasks.
- The body of your response should be between 80 and 100 words (8 10 lines) in length.

- Pay particular attention to format, language, register and audience.
- Spend approximately 30 minutes on this section.

- Spend approximately 30 minutes on this section.
